









Role The EGMP Agriculture Task Force

The role of the EGM IWG Agriculture Task Force is to:

- 1) Assist the EGM IWG in coordinating and catalysing the implementation of activities related to goose management and agriculture under the EGMP;
- 2) <u>Assist</u> the EGM IWG in <u>stimulating and supporting</u> Range States in the implementation of activities related to goose management and agriculture; and
- 3) monitor and report on the implementation of these activities to the EGM IWG via the UNEP/AEWA Secretariat and the National Reports to the EGM IWG, as appropriate.








Tasks

The EGM IWG Agriculture Task Force will:

- develop and support the implementation of an <u>international interdisciplinary cooperation framework</u> for dealing with interaction between geese and agriculture;
- assist in other ways as requested by the EGM IWG.


